Title: Amending The Building Permit Fee Schedule For Solar Energy Systems

WHEREAS, Adam Gordon, the Building Inspector, in his memo dated December 18, 2023, referenced as if set forth hereinafter, a true copy of which shall be appended to the Minutes hereof, recommends for the reasons set forth therein, that the Building Permit fee associated with the cost of construction of a NYSERDA approved Solar Electric Energy Power Generation System be lumped in with and not differentiated from any other aspect of construction of a building; and

WHEREAS, as reported by the Building Inspector and confirmed by the Clerk to the Building Department, the Department reviews all plans, certifications and on-site as builts which is a labor-intensive activity, and is fully a function of the size and complexity of the subject system; and

WHEREAS, as the Building Inspector and the Clerk also report, the norm in the vicinity of the Village is to lump in the cost of the Solar Electric System with other costs in calculating the fee without first differentiating the Solar Electric System cost, and neither the Village Attorney nor the Assistant Village Attorney could find a statutory or regulatory source requiring such differentiation; and

WHEREAS, a comment made in the 2017 Comprehensive Development Plan encouraging clean energy may have been over-applied to commercial and residential sites alike by limiting the fee associated with each such application in the Fee Permit Schedule to \$250, irrespective the cost of such system, and that commercial systems are likely already highly incentivized by grants, rebates, tax credits, and large-scale energy savings; and

WHEREAS, the cost to the Village administratively and expense-wise greatly exceeds the \$250 arbitrarily applied across the board to oversee the design and construction of such systems, there seeming to be no prudent or rational reason to continue such differentiation.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that, effective January 1, 2024, for the foregoing reasons, the Permit Fee Schedule be amended by eliminating one of the two solar power system entries, altogether, and by qualifying the other such that it reads: "\$250 – NYSERDA approved Solar Electric Energy Power Generation System (for one- or two-family residences, only); for Commercial installations, see Building Permit Schedule Fee."
